Appendix 21 - Lift Area Skiing and Snowboarding Standards

 The teacher must inform parents of students supplying their own equipment that the equipment must be in good repair and should be checked and/or adjusted by a certified technician. Only community or commercially operated ski facilities with suitable teaching areas (gentle slope) should be used. 	 The ski area must be defined to the students so they are aware of the boundaries for the activity. As a first activity: All students should be tested and grouped appropriately as determined by a certified ski/snowboard instructor. Students must participate in at least one lesson for each activity plan, an activity plan could include several trips to the hill. Only those students identified by the instructor may use snowboards. Students should ski in areas identified as appropriate for them by the qualified ski instructor.
